


#### Our mission

This interconnection of organisations exposes audiences to different architectural ideas that have shaped and continue to shape architecture in Europe. By engaging different stakeholders in a debate, Open House Europe prompts people to imagine, shape and build a common future.

### Local Open House festivals

Open House Europe serves as a network linking 14 local Open House festivals. The events offer free guided tours of notable buildings in various cities, also, including lectures, discussions, performances, and other engaging activities. Open House Europe fosters accessibility and creates interactive tools to reveal architecture's role as part of European identity and showcase positive examples of how architecture could respond to contemporary environmental and social challenges.





# Activities



## Annual Theme

#### Why this is important?

Throughout the year, different local Open House events across Europe respond to a common Annual Theme by highlighting the buildings in the local Open House festival programme or having other theme related activities. This is important to face challenges by contemporary planetary and civil society, following the values of the New European Bauhaus initiative.

In 2023 Open House Europe Annual Theme was 'Sustainability - Building Futures Together'. The preliminary Annual Themes for 2024 and 2025 are 'Access and Inclusion' and 'Future Heritage'.



## Visual Stories

#### About the activity

Every year, Open House Europe launches an international open call for visual stories, encouraging participants to share their views on architecture and reflect on the Annual Theme through photography, film, drawing and other visual art forms.

The selected Visual Stories become an exhibition and travel across Europe to various Open House Europe partner organisations. Additionally, selected works are featured in a printed publication and online.




## Visual Stories

#### How to participate?

To participate in the Visual Stories open call, applicants need to submit their creative interpretations of the Annual Theme, based on experiences during the local Open House festival.

While exploring buildings, areas and sites during the festival visitors seek out elements of the Annual Theme within the city's architecture and urban planning. Creative visual narratives that capture experience and offer deeper understandings and personal interpretations of the theme are encouraged.

## Volunteer Exchange Programme

### About the activity

To encourage the exchange of knowledge and experience, Open House Europe facilitates volunteer exchanges between partner organisations. The programme is dedicated to international learning and collaboration among European cities and Open House Europe partners.

In 2023, exchanges were held across all 11 partner organisations in Europe. 57 volunteers participated, actively contributing to the success of Open House events while also gaining valuable insights to bring back for their local festivals.

#### About the activity

The Annual Summit is a gathering of the Open House community, architecture enthusiasts and professionals. Each summit, held in partner cities Lisbon (2023), Dublin (2024) and Athens (2025), features a dynamic public programme with inspiring discussions, lectures, workshops and guided tours. Besides this, the summit is a unique opportunity for the Open House community, including anyone who is planning to launch an Open House festival in their city, to come together, learn, exchange knowledge and share experiences.

## Digitalisation

#### About the activity

To seamlessly unite the diverse activities of Open House Europe and effectively present them to wider audiences, a website has been established, complemented by an in-progress mobile application. These digital tools help to enhance the experience of local events as well as work as a live archive for architectural projects presented during Open House festivals.

Additionally, the Digital Atlas is now under development. This will be an interactive map-archive that presents architecture objects with information gathered from Open House events.



## Audience Development

#### About the activity

To enhance the audience's engagement in various Open House Europe consortium activities Audience Development Guide was created. This tool gathers the best practices and recommendations for digital and physical solutions for engaging, making inclusive and accessible various Open House events.

To monitor Open House Europe user experience, visitors will be asked to participate in quantitative surveys and qualitative feedback.
